# **SECTION 2: Communications to Parents**

#### ClassDojo - app for parents

- Each teacher has set up a classroom community for parents
- Once students are enrolled, an email is sent to parents/families to join the ClassDojo page
- This app allows teachers to message parents directly or as a group, provide daily feedback and share great things happening in the classroom.
- This app also allows parents to message teachers directly and throughout the day.

Other Stevens administration also uses this app to send all digital communications to the parents to inform them of changes to policy, upcoming events, or any other relevant information needed

### **Parent/Teacher Conferences**

• Structured meetings include meet the teacher, open house, and teacher/parent requests for meetings

• Report cards are sent every 6 weeks and follow the HISD calendar. This information is updated yearly on the HISD Calendar



# **SECTION 3: Dress Code**

- Monday Friday: Students may wear a white, navy or yellow solid polo style shirt with navy or khaki bottoms (white or blue leggings and tights are permitted under skirts and dresses when the weather is cold).
  - Mondays: Students may wear college shirts and jeans (no rips or tears)
  - Fridays: Students may wear a Spirit shirt and jeans
- Most major retailers (e.g., Target, Walmart, etc.) have a school uniform section, and there are also used uniform clothing exchanges. Supplies often run out fast, so shop early.
- The PTCO sells Spirit shirts. Each year, a new T-shirt design will be sent out for pre-order and the standard Spirit shirt will always be available for order. Refer to SECTION 13: Parent-Teacher Community Organization (PTCO) for contact information


# **SECTION 5: Drop off and Pick up Information Drop off procedures**

- Student drop off times vary based on grade. Gates cannot be opened to the school prior to 7:15am.
  - o Pre-K through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade drop off is at 7:15am.
  - o 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade drop off is at 7:25am.
- Car Riders:
  - Drop off for all students is on the south side of the school on Lamonte Lane. Traffic on Lamonte becomes one-way only during drop off, flowing west from Rosslyn toward Donna Bell
    - The easiest driving approach is southbound on Rosslyn, then right on Lamonte
    - Stevens faculty are present during drop off to assist children exiting cars and entering campus.
  - The entrance on Saxon is reserved as a bus/PALS unloading zone and is closed to parent parking during drop off
- Walkers:
  - Walkers/bikers enter through one of the two gates on Lamonte Ln.
     Parents are encouraged to walk the child to the gate and allow their child to independently enter the school
  - Crossing guards are present at both ends of Lamonte and will control traffic for pedestrian access

### Pick up Procedures

- Student drop off times vary based on grade. Gates cannot be opened to the school prior to 2:45pm.
  - o Pre-K through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade pick up is at 2:45pm.
  - o 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade pick up is at 2:55pm.
- At the beginning of the school year, parents may elect whether their child will be considered a walker, car rider, bus rider or after care student. Children will receive a sign indicating which category is elected.
  - If a child needs to change their pickup method during the school year, the parent should notify the teacher through DOJO.
- Car rider: Parents or guardians must have a sign placed on the dash of the car
  - Pick up occurs on the south side of the school on Lamonte Lane.
     Traffic on Lamonte becomes one-way only during drop off, flowing west from Rosslyn toward Donna Bell
    - The easiest driving approach is southbound on Rosslyn, then right on Lamonte
    - Stevens faculty are present during pick up to assist children exiting cars and entering campus.
- Bus/PALS: Bus riders load onto buses at the corner of Saxon Dr. and Rosslyn
- <u>Walkers / bikers:</u> Parents or guardians must have a green sign in hand and may pick up children at one of the two gates on Lamonte Lane.
- <u>After-care Program</u> Please refer to SECTION 7: After-Care Program for more information

 <u>Parking</u> – please be kind to the neighbors and avoid parking in driveways and yards or blocking streets and entrances / exits. Please read all signage around the school premises as some areas are no parking or for buses only



# SECTION 6: Absences, Late Arrivals, and Early Departures

- Your child must be present by 9:30 am or they are marked absent for the day.
- If your child arrives after the appropriate arrival time for their grade, notify the front office and the child's teacher through ClassDojo



# **SECTION 9: Breakfast and Lunch Procedures**

HISD received a grant that provides free breakfast and lunch to all students
in the district. Breakfast and lunch menus are set by HISD and can be found
here: <a href="https://www.houstonisd.org/Page/68611">https://www.houstonisd.org/Page/68611</a>. Menus are set based on
supply chain and are subject to change. Changes are not communicated to
the school in advance.

• Students are encouraged to bring reusable water bottles to school labeled with their name. Teachers have bottled water for students if they need to refill their water bottle from home throughout the day.

#### Breakfast

- o Breakfast is handed out to students on the way to class.
- Students have breakfast in their classrooms

#### Lunch

- Students eat lunches in the cafeteria, and in 30-minute increments
- The lunch schedules are staggered by grade level, with the youngest students eating earliest followed by older students
- Teachers lead students to the cafeteria; they are seated in class groups.
- Currently, parents or guardians are not permitted to attend lunch.
- Bringing lunch and water from home:
  - Stevens is a nut free campus. Children should not bring any items containing nuts.
  - Parents can pack lunch for their child; however, using ice packs is encouraged. Students do not have access to refrigerators or microwaves to keep lunches cold or warm up food.

# SECTION 10: Student Daily Schedule and Curriculum

### Daily Class Schedules

This information is fluid and changes based on the year's needs. Teachers provide the classroom schedule via DOJO and communicate changes through DOJO as they occur.

### Structure of Student's Day

- Students are currently self-contained in PK, K, and first grade. Second through fifth grade have more than one (typically) two teachers.
- Basics:
  - Lunch is 30 minutes a day
  - o Recess is 30 minutes a day
  - Students will attend once ancillary class per day for 50 minutes.
     Ancillary classes may include PE, Art, Science/Social Studies, Library, Technology and Yoga.

### STEAM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math

STEAM programing is predominately imbedded into ancillary classes (Science Lab, Technology, Theatre Arts – hosted in Library). Students also have access to a

Physical Education class and Yoga class) – these class change based on campus initiatives for the year and student's interest.

# **SECTION 11: Special School Events**

#### Meet-the-Teacher

- Meet the teacher is essential in providing important orientation information about your child to the teacher and obtaining classroom information.
- The event typically occurs 1 week prior to the start of school. Parents are notified via email, phone call or DOJO.

# SECTION 12: School Visitation/Volunteering/Donation Procedures

#### School Visitation

- School visits can be arranged in advance with your child's teacher, and such visits are encouraged for various parental involvement events (reading, other special events) either at the classroom or school level.
- All visitors must sign in at the front desk and must have a valid governmentissued photo ID to enter the school grounds.
- All visitors are given a visitor name tag to wear while they are present on the grounds.

### **Donation to Teachers/Classrooms**

- Parents may donate supplies requested by the teacher as needed. Parents are encouraged to drop supplies off after 8:00AM
- All food items sent on designated party days must be store bought and individually wrapped.
- Teachers may receive gifts at parents' discretion
